WHAT DOES THE WORD "LENT" MEAN?

The word Lent is apparently derived from the Old English Lencten, which means "lengthen." It refers to the lengthening of the daylight hours as spring approaches. In Latin, Lent is Quadragesima which means forty days. In Christianity, Lent is a time dedicated in a special way to conversion and renewal; to prayer, to fasting and to works of charity, a preparation for baptism or recollection of our baptism, and preparation for the celebration of Easter. It is a season that reminds us to repent and get our lives centered, our priorities straight, and our hearts clean. Lent is a time to journey with Jesus on the Cross, the total giving of his life even to dying on the cross for our salvation.

We go into our own deserts, our own disciplines, our own fast knowing that through the days and months of our lives we have added baggage to our load that is not helpful, is not life giving, and is in the same way an actual wall between us and our God. Lent is not only a time for giving things up. It is also an excellent opportunity for us to take on new practices. It is good not only to give up bad habits, but also to form positive ones.
