THREE STEP REOPENING PLAN FOR THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO

Premier Doug Ford announced May 20 a three-step reopening plan for the province.

The steps for the plan are listed below. The timelines are approximate, but the government has announced that each step will last for at least 21 days unless the metric listed below is achieved earlier.

It was hoped that at Step 1, churches would progress beyond the cap of 10 persons. To that end, there will be further dialogue with the locals MPPs and the provincial government. Information will be shared with the clergy and faithful as it becomes available.

In the meantime, the Churches and Missions will continue to limit the attendance to 10 people (including the celebrant and liturgical ministers.)

Let us continue to pray for all of those impacted by the pandemic and to hold each other in our prayers.

Dear Reverend Monsignor and Reverend Fathers,

It was disappointing to learn last week that the provincial government's Reopening Three Step Plan leaves churches at a hard cap of ten people indoors in the first step, while making some allowance for outdoor services. I have contacted local MPP's to express my concern at the continuation of such a strict limit for churches, pointing out that non-essential retail outlets are being allowed a percentage of building capacity in step one.

Cardinal Collins, Bishop Fabbro (President of the ACBO) and other faith leaders are meeting next week with the Premier and officials involved with the Three Step Reopening Plan. We pray that their meetings may result in a review of the Plan. An update following the meeting will be sent to you at the end of next week. In the meantime, I ask you privately to keep this intention in your own prayers.

On behalf of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), I express our deepest sorrow for the heartrending loss of the children at the former Kamloops Indian Residential School on the Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc First Nation.

The news of the recent discovery is shocking. It rekindles trauma in numerous communities across this land. Honouring the dignity of the lost little ones demands that the truth be brought to light.

This tragedy profoundly impacts Indigenous communities, with whom many people across this land and throughout the world now stand in solidarity.

As we see ever more clearly the pain and suffering of the past, the Bishops of Canada pledge to continue walking side by side with Indigenous Peoples in the present, seeking greater healing and reconciliation for the future.

We lift up prayers to the Lord for the children who have lost their lives and pledge our close accompaniment of Indigenous families and communities.

May our Creator God bless all of us with consolation and hope.
