THREE STEP REOPENING PLAN FOR THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO

Premier Doug Ford announced May 20 a three-step reopening plan for the province.

The steps for the plan are listed below. The timelines are approximate, but the government has announced that each step will last for at least 21 days unless the metric listed below is achieved earlier.

It was hoped that at Step 1, churches would progress beyond the cap of 10 persons. To that end, there will be further dialogue with the locals MPPs and the provincial government. Information will be shared with the clergy and faithful as it becomes available.

In the meantime, the Churches and Missions will continue to limit the attendance to 10 people (including the celebrant and liturgical ministers.)

Let us continue to pray for all of those impacted by the pandemic and to hold each other in our prayers.

Dear Reverend Fathers;

The joy of reopening our parishes is very much mitigated by our sorrow over the discovery of the remains of children at the former Indian Residential School in Kamloops. This is a difficult time for the Church and Indigenous peoples and has highlighted for us the need for more efforts at reconciliation. I was heartened to see the announcement by the CCCB yesterday, that a long-planned-for delegation of Indigenous Leaders and residential school survivors will make the trip to Rome for an encounter with Pope Francis before the end of the year. This has been quietly on the drawing board for a long time (at least two years) and was supposed to have happened by the end of 2020: alas, the realities of the pandemic and travel restrictions delayed it considerably. Let us pray that it may happen soon and will be a significant step in the ongoing process of reconciliation.

Once again, Fathers, despite the challenges of these times, I pray that you may continue to know the joy of serving Christ in the priesthood, that you may grow each day in the holiness of your calling, and that we may always support one another in priestly fraternity.
