This year's campaign theme is **People and Planet First**. Learn more at devp.org.

Every week, four people are murdered or face daily violence simply because they are defenders of human and environmental rights. Communities seeking to protect their rights to healthy land, air and water are often threatened and criminalized. This climate of insecurity is often fuelled by the presense and power of mining, agribusiness or textile companies, some of which are Canadian. It is important that Canadian companies respect human and environmental rights in all their activities in the Global South and thus contribute to what Pope Francis call an "ecological conversion."

A law is needed to require Canadian companies to act responsibly abroad; it would help protect the men and women defending the earth by giving them a right to recourse in Canadian courts. We can challenge our elected officials and raise awareness in our communities about the climate emergency as well as listen to our sisters and brothers affected by environmental destruction.

We can take action alongside those in the Global South who are fighting for their rights and for preservation of the earth. How can we help? By signing the petition for a new law requiring Canadian companies to prevent human rights and environmental harm across their entire global operations and supply chains.

We will have a petition for you to sign at the back of the church in November.

Pope Francis accepts Canadian Bishops' invitation to come to Canada to support the journey of healing and reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples.

It is my honour to inform you that the Holy Father has accepted the invitation of the Bishops of Canada to visit the Church in Canada in the context of a pilgrimage of healing and reconciliation with our Indigenous sisters and brothers. This announcement builds on three years of constructive dialogue between the Canadian Bishops, the Holy See, and Indigenous Peoples who have generously shared their experiences and stories about the suffering and challenges that continue to this day. The Holy Father's announcement is in response to the expectations expressed by the Bishops during the last meeting of the CCCB Plenary Assembly.

The Holy Father was moved by the profound desire of the Bishops of Canada and the Indigenous Peoples that he come to Canada on a pilgrimage of healing and reconciliation. This is a process already underway, thanks to a joint delegation to Rome that will take place 17-20 December 2021, where Pope Francis will hear directly from Indigenous Peoples on the historical and ongoing legacy of residential schools, as well as their hopes and desires for his visit to Canada.
