Faith in a time of crisis

Psychologists' research shows why some people can find peace during the COVID-19 pandemic, while others may be struggling with their faith.

Kenneth Pargament, PhD, professor emeritus of psychology at Bowling Green State University, who since the 1980s has been on the forefront of the research on religion and resilience. That research identified positive and negative forms of religious coping — as well as <u>evidence</u> that how people experience and express their faith has implications for their well-being and health.

What are those positive effects? Research shows that religion can help people cope with adversity by:

Encouraging them to reframe events through a hopeful lens. Positive religious reframing can help people transcend stressful times by enabling them to see a tragedy as an opportunity to grow closer to a higher power or to improve their lives.

Fostering a sense of connectedness. Some people see religion as making them part of something larger than themselves. This can happen through prayer or meditation, or through taking part in religious meetings, listening to spiritual music or even walking outside.

Cultivating connection through rituals. Religious rituals and rites of passage can help people acknowledge that something momentous is taking place. "It is extremely important that people use their beliefs in a way that makes them feel empowered and hopeful," says Thomas Plante, PhD, a professor of psychology at Santa Clara University, "Because it can be remarkably helpful in terms of managing stress during times like this."

The negative religious expressions include:

Feeling punished by God or feeling angry toward a higher being. Trauma and tragedy can challenge conceptions of God as all-loving and protective. As a result, some people struggle in their relationship with God and experience feelings of anger, abandonment or being punished by a higher power.

Putting it all "in God's hands." When people engage in "religious deferral," they believe God is in charge of their well-being and may not take the necessary steps to protect themselves.

Falling into moral struggles. People can have difficulty squaring their behavior with their moral and spiritual values, decisions that put them in the uncomfortable role of playing God.

"Religion has been helping people get through hard times for thousands of years," Plante says. "It's tested and ready to go at a moment's notice. Just read the psalms and you will see that it is all about people turning to God during troubled times."
