<u>7 SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY</u> - The Spiritual Works of Mercy have long been a part of the Christian tradition throughout history. Just as Jesus attended to the spiritual well-being of those he ministered to, these Spiritual Works of Mercy guide us to help our neighbor in their spiritual needs. The seven spiritual actions of mercy are: 1. To admonish the sinner, 2. To instruct the ignorant, 3. To counsel the doubtful, 4. To comfort the sorrowful, 5. To bear wrongs patiently, 6. To forgive all injuries, 7. To pray for the living and the dead.

#TO ADMONISH THE SINNER - This spiritual act of mercy concerns with the spiritual well-being of another. To admonish someone is to warn about a fault; to correct wrongdoing; to remind someone to do the right thing. To admonish the sinner is not to belittle or humiliate him, but rather to alert him to the danger of a sinful course of action. It is rooted in love, not pride.

A GOOD CHRISTIAN IS GOOD CITIZEN - Being a good Christian citizen involves living a life that reflects the teachings of Jesus Christ and positively contributing to your community. As a Christian, it is your responsibility to be an active and engaged member of society, showing love and kindness to your neighbors, and following the laws of the land. Good Christians are kind, decent people who advocate for justice, are compassionate, generous, and resourceful. They also settle their opinions thoughtfully and remain studious and curious. Ultimately, being a good Christian means believing, loving, and hoping rightly and truly. So, in essence, a good Christian is indeed a good citizen.

ISRAEL ORDERS MORE GAZA EVACUATIONS - A new evacuation order issued by the Israeli authorities has seen thousands of Gazans again fleeing parts of the Khan Younis area. Estimates indicate that more than 15,500 people had been living in the affected areas. At the same time, the World Food Programme has warned that hostilities, unusable roads, and the lack of public order and safety severely hamper food transport operations in Gaza, forcing reduced rations. Meanwhile, Israel has responded to US, Qatari and Egyptian mediators by confirming it would send a mission to resume talks on a Gaza truce deal next week.



MARY'S ASSUMPTION

DOGMA OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BVM (Feast Day August 15) – "The Catholic Church teaches that the Virgin Mary "having

completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory". This doctrine was dogmatically defined by Pope Pius XII on 1 November 1950, in the apostolic constitution *Munificentissimus Deus*. This is a belief in the Catholic Church that has its origin in the first few centuries of Christianity that honors the Virgin Mary and her role in salvation history and the eternal destination prepared for her by her Son, Jesus. We firmly believe that from the first moment of her conception Mary was free of all sin, including Original Sin, by a special favor of almighty God. Mary had been chosen to be the Mother of our savior. By the power of the Holy Spirit, she conceived our Lord Jesus Christ, and through her, true God became also man and dwelt among us. All these led the Church to conclude that because of her role as Mother of the Messiah, Mary would be preserved from original sin and its consequences. As such it would not be possible for Mary, whose womb carried the Son of God, to suffer the corruption of the body that all people experience after death. Mary's assumption reminds us that salvation is holistic. God does not just save half of us; we are saved in the fullness of our humanity, body and soul.
