<u>7 SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY</u> - The Spiritual Works of Mercy have long been a part of the Christian tradition throughout history. Just as Jesus attended to the spiritual well-being of those he ministered to, these Spiritual Works of Mercy guide us to help our neighbor in their spiritual needs. The seven spiritual actions of mercy are: 1. To admonish the sinner, 2. To instruct the ignorant, 3. To counsel the doubtful, 4. To comfort the sorrowful, 5. To bear wrongs patiently, 6. To forgive all injuries, 7. To pray for the living and the dead.

#2 TO INSTRUCT THE IGNORANT - Biblically speaking, this action comes directly from Jesus when He instructs His apostles, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." This act of mercy is about sharing our faith and experiences with Christ and his church to those around us who either have not experienced faith in their own lives or are simply unaware as to what a life of faith looks like. This command flows directly from Jesus' life and ministry.

ST. AUGUSTINE (feast day Aug 28) "He was born year 354 in Algeria. He spent many years of his life in wicked living and in false beliefs. Though he was one of the most intelligent men who ever lived and had been brought up a Christian, his sins of impurity and his pride darkened his mind so much that he could not see or understand the Divine Truth anymore. Through the prayers of his holy mother Monica and the marvelous preaching of St. Ambrose, Augustine finally became convinced that Christianity was the one true religion. Yet he did not become a Christian then, because he thought he could never live a pure life. One day he heard about two men converted. He felt terribly ashamed of himself. "What are we doing, unlearned people are taking heaven by force, while we, with all our knowledge, are so cowardly that we keep rolling around in the mud of our sins!" Full of sorrow he cried out, "How long more, O Lord? Why does not this hour put an end to my sins?" Just then he heard a voice saying, "Take up and read!" He picked up the book of the Letters of St. Paul and read the passage that was just what Augustine needed, for in it, St. Paul says to put away all impurity and to live in imitation of Jesus. From then on, Augustine began a new life. He was baptized, became a priest, a bishop, a famous Catholic writer, Founder of religious priests, and one of the greatest saints that ever lived. He became very devout and charitable, practiced great poverty and supported the poor, preached and prayed with great fervor right up until his death. His complete turnaround and conversion has been an inspiration to many who struggle with a particular vice or habit they long to break."
