

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

<u>POPE'S PRAYER INTENTION FOR MONTH OF SEPTEMBER</u> - (For The Cry Of The Earth) "We pray that each one of us will hear and take to heart the cry of the earth and of victims of natural disasters and climatic change, and that all will undertake to personally care for the world in which we live."

POPE FRANCIS VISITS INDONESIA -The pope's visit shores up interfaith tolerance in world's most populous Muslim nation. According to the Indonesia's Ministry of Home Affairs, 87 percent of Indonesia's 282 million people are Muslim, 7.4 percent are Protestant, 3 percent Roman Catholic, 1.7 percent Hindu and just under 1 percent Buddhist. With 245 million Sunni, Shia and other adherents to Islam Indonesia is the world's most populous Muslim nation. During Mass at Jakarta's main stadium, Pope Francis told the more than 100,000 Indonesians in attendance: "Be builders of hope. Guided by the word of the Lord. I encourage you to sow seeds of love, confidently tread the path of dialogue, continue to show your goodness and kindness...and be builders of unity and peace."

SEPTEMBER 8, MOTHER MARY'S BIRTHDAY - The birth of Mary is ordained in particular toward her mission as Mother of the Savior. Her existence is indissolubly connected with that of Christ: it partakes of a unique plan of predestination and grace. God's mysterious plan regarding the Incarnation of the Word embraces also the Virgin who is His Mother. In this way, the Birth of Mary, as that her Divine Child, is inserted at the very heart of the History of Salvation. (From the Liturgy) "Let us celebrate with joy the birth of the Virgin Mary, of whom was born the Sun of Justice.... Her birth constitutes the hope and the light of salvation for the whole world.... Her image is light for the whole Christian people".

FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE CROSS (Sept 14) - The Feast of the Exaltation of the

Holy Cross, also known as the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross, commemorates three historical events: the discovery of the True Cross in 326, its initial exaltation for public veneration in 335, and the recovery of the Cross from the Persians in 628. Nowadays, this feast also celebrates the boundless impact of Christ's Cross upon all of creation. In 326, Constantine's mother, Saint Helena embarked on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land with a

mission to find & identify the cross used to crucify Jesus. Following the successful discovery of the True Cross in Calvary, Emperor Constantine ordered the construction of a church over Jesus' tomb, known as the Holy Sepulchre. In 614, the Persians invaded Jerusalem and took the True Cross as a trophy. But in 622, Emperor Heraclius initiated military campaigns to successfully recapture Jerusalem and the True Cross in 628. After that, the Feast of the Holy Cross became a universal celebration annually on September 14 ever since. Inspired by St. Paul who said, "May I never boast except in the cross of Christ", today and always we say, we adore you Christ and we bless you because by holy cross you have redeemed the world.
