SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY - The Spiritual Works of Mercy have long been a part of the Christian tradition throughout history. Just as Jesus attended to the spiritual well-being of those he ministered to, these Spiritual Works of Mercy guide us to help our neighbor in their spiritual needs. The seven spiritual actions of mercy are: 1. To admonish the sinner, 2. To instruct the ignorant, 3. To counsel the doubtful, 4. To comfort the sorrowful, 5. To bear wrongs patiently, 6. To forgive all injuries, 7. To pray for the living and the dead. #5 BEARING WRONGS PATIENTLY - Bearing wrongs patiently is a difficult yet ultimately rewarding act of mercy for all involved if practiced regularly. It is easy to grow resentful and bitter, wanting someone or something to blame for the set-backs and situations we face. It is also easy to become frustrated with those living with us in our homes day in and day out, but to seek patience, willingly riding through setbacks and focusing not on wrongs but on rights and reconciliation is much more fruitful in the long run, especially with those we see on a daily basis. Bearing wrongs patiently takes courage and a good starting point is to remind ourselves of the ways Christ has provided for us and forgiven us in the past, and reminding ourselves of this might make it a little easier to do the same for others.

<u>SPIRITUAL GROWTH</u> – Spiritual growth is all about deepening our relationship with God according to biblical principles, leading to a life that increasingly mirrors the character and love of Jesus Christ. How? 1. Engage with Scriptures: To immerse ourselves in the Bible to understand God's will for our life. 2. Cultivate a Prayer Habit: To establish a consistent prayer practice to maintain an ongoing dialogue with God. 3. Join a Faith Community: To connect with other Christians for mutual support and encouragement. 4. Serve Others: To use our gifts to serve our church and community, reflecting God's love. 5. "YOU ARE CHRIST, THE SON OF THE LIVING GOD": a short, but a very full confession of faith, containing the following articles: as that there is a God, that there is but one God; that he is the living God: that Jesus is the Christ, the true Messiah, that was promised by God, prophesied of by all the prophets, from the beginning of the world, and expected by the people of God: a character that includes all his offices, of prophet, priest, and king, to which he is anointed by God; and that this Messiah was not a mere man, but a divine person, the Son of God; not by creation, as angels and men are, but by nature, being his own Son, the only begotten of the Father, of the same nature with him, being one with him, and equal to him. Peter, full of the Holy Spirit, cannot be wrong with this confession.

POPE FRANCIS VIISITS 4 NATIONS ACROSS ASIA & OCEANIA - "Pope Francis makes an Apostolic Journey to Indonesia, Papua New Guinea, Timor-Leste, and Singapore on September 2-13, 2024. Indonesia is the world's largest Muslim country with 8 million Catholics, Papua New Guinea has 2 million Catholics, Timor-Leste with 1 million Catholics, Singapore has 395,000 Catholics. Pope Francis' travel to these places is to reinforce the importance that Asia has for the Catholic Church, since it's one of the few places where the church is growing in terms of baptized faithful and religious vocations. And Francis is highlighting that the complex region also embodies some of his core priorities as pope — an emphasis on interreligious and intercultural dialogue, care for the environment and insistence on the spiritual component of economic development."

THE BEAUTY OF GROWTH - As we grow, our priorities often shift. God tends to find its way into our hearts as we journey through life. Sometimes it's a quiet whisper during a sunrise, or a thunderous revelation during our darkest nights. It's that cosmic nudge that reminds us there's something greater than ourselves—a force that weaves through the fabric of existence. As we age, our priorities evolve. The things that once consumed our thoughts—career ambitions, material possessions, or even the pursuit of love—can gradually take a backseat. Suddenly, we find ourselves pondering deeper questions: What's the purpose of it all? How do we connect with something beyond the mundane? Whether it's through prayer, meditation, or simply gazing at the stars, that connection with the divine becomes essential. In those quiet moments, we find that God has been there all along, waiting patiently for us to notice."
