To forgive all injuries, 7. To pray for the living and the dead. #7 TO PRAY FOR THE LIVING & THE DEAD - St. Paul writes in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-17 that the task of the Christian is to "rejoice always" and to "pray without ceasing." Praying for others, both the living and the dead, is at the heart of the Catholic faith. We pray not only for ourselves and our needs, but also for the needs of others. We believe that we can assist those in need by praying for them. This is why praying for the living and the dead is considered a spiritual work of mercy. In Bible accounts we read that communities are encouraged to pray for those sick and suffering and how "the prayer of faith will save the sick person" (James 5:15) and that if they have committed sins, those will be forgiven because "fervent prayer of a righteous person is very powerful" (James 5:16).

MICHAEL, GABRIEL & RAPHAEL (feast day Sept 29) - These three Archangels are venerated in the tradition of the Church. Michael (Who is like God?) was the archangel who fought against Satan and all his evil angels, defending all the friends of God. He is the protector of all humanity from the snares of the devil. Gabriel (Strength of God) announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary, the birth of Jesus. His greeting to the Virgin, "Hail, full of grace," is one of the most familiar and frequent prayers of the Christian people. Raphael (Medicine of God) is the archangel who took care of Tobias on his journey. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that, "The existence of the spiritual, non-corporeal beings that Sacred Scripture usually calls "angels" is a truth of faith. Angels are pure, created spirits. The name angel means servant or messenger of God. Angels are heavenly beings, on a higher order than human beings. Angels have no bodies and do not depend on matter for their existence or activity. They are distinct from saints, which men can become. Angels have intellect and will, and are immortal. ST. JEROME

(feast day Sept 30) - Jerome born in year 342 in Dalmatia, Croatia is known for his rhetorical skills and mastery of languages that enabled him to translate Hebrew and Greek books of the Bible into Latin, the language of common people. This translation is called, the "Vulgate". His accomplishments in biblical studies are without parallel in Christian history. He is a Doctor of the Church, and patron of scripture scholars, translators, archaeologists, librarian and students.
