<u>THE HOLY BIBLE</u> - The Vulgate Translation, completed by St. Jerome in 405 A.D., is one of the most important Latin translations of the Bible in Catholic history. Commissioned by Pope Damasus I, the Vulgate became the standard version of the Bible in the Western



Church for over 1,000 years after it was finished. Jerome's translation was based on the Hebrew and Greek manuscripts available at the time, and it served as the authoritative Latin Bible for the Catholic Church.

THE DOCTRINE ON COMMUNION OF SAINTS - The communion of saints is a timely topic as we enter the month of November, the month we celebrate All Saints (Nov. 1) and All Souls (Nov. 2). This core belief is stated in the Apostles' Creed: "I believe in the communion of saints." We can even form friendships with the saints who have gone before us whom we never knew in this life. We can also do good for the dead through our prayers. Friendship with Jesus calls us out of ourselves and into relationship with so many others. And that includes the whole Church, those on earth, in purgatory, or in heaven."
