<u>THE HOLY BIBLE</u> (The Four Senses of the Bible-) The Bible's message comes through both literal historical records and rich symbolic language. Discerning when to interpret the Bible literally and when to see it sym-



bolically requires attention to context, genre, historical setting, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. As Paul writes, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16). The Bible's inspiration provides a foundation for us to approach its words carefully, seeking God's intended message in both the literal and symbolic. Through balanced study, we can gain wisdom, understand God's nature, and grow in faith. The Church, at the Second Vatican Council, gave three criteria in Dei Verbum for "interpreting Scripture in accordance with the Spirit who inspired it" (CCC 111): Be especially attentive "to the content and unity of the whole Scripture". Read the Scripture within "the living Tradition of the whole Church". Be attentive to the analogy of faith.

RELIGIOUS PERSECUTION WORLDWIDE - A growing crisis for all humanity. The Church, under the guidance of Pope Francis - dubbed the "Pope of the peripheries" - continues to stand firm in its fight for religious freedom across the globe, and Pope Francis so often extends his prayers and closeness to all people who suffer any form of injustice worldwide, no matter the faith and no matter the creed, as "we are all members of one human family". Today, millions of believers face discrimination, violence, and even death simply for practicing their faith.
